

The second round of the MAP GROWTH assessments (Reading and Math) will be administered to our students during the week of January 13th. The results of these assessments will continue to be utilized in an ongoing effort to accurately measure student performance and growth (i.e. how much growth has occurred between testing events) and, when combined with national norms, will show projected proficiency. Additionally, this data will also be utilized to appropriately plan individualized learning for all students. Detailed student reports will be sent home following the assessments.




# **JHIS 2019 Holiday Concert**
