

A.L.I.C.E. (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate) provides "choices" for responding to emergency situations, rather than relying on a "Lockdown" in all situations. The adult in charge, after assessing the situation, may decide that other options are available, such as the opportunity to evacuate the building rather than go into a "Lockdown." Safety will always remain our number one priority and we remain hopeful that this response will never be needed, but much like our monthly fire drills, it is imperative Evacuate that we are proactive in our response to a variety of situations. 
