



**POLICY 222 -- STUDENTS AND THE POLICE**

**1. Purpose**

The Board recognizes that compulsory attendance laws impose on the Board the custodianship of the public school children of the district while they are present in the schools.

**2. Authority**

When police request permission to interrogate a student at school, the principal will inform the Superintendent and attempt to inform the student's parents.

Whenever the Superintendent or designee has determined that the police have a legitimate purpose in interrogating a child within the confines of a school building, the principal or his/her representative will be present throughout the proceedings.

When the police request permission to arrest a student at school, the principal will inform the Superintendent, attempt to inform the student's parents, and request and inspect the arrest warrant.

No child will be released to police authorities without proper warrant, appropriate evidence, or written parental permission except in the event of emergency or for the protection of life or property as determined by the principal.
