- Clearinghouse data shows that our students are not being successful at the secondary level
- Promote student agency and decision making
- Promote project-based learning
- Change the focus from completion and compliance to learning

Personalized Learning Time:

Getting Help - Opportunities for Academic Intervention and Enrichment

Opportunities to explore curricula offered outside of the district (online college courses, test preparation, MOOCS, special programs)

Time to meet with school counselors to focus on career and postsecondary planning, receiving application/scholarship assistance, meet with college and career admission officers and representatives

Allow students to explore interests, develop passion for topics, and provides opportunities for students to explore content, do research, complete community service at a greater level of engagement

Increase student morale - Brain Break during the day

Reduce classroom interruptions

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Personalized Learning Time

Students would be able to choose:

2 (30 minute activities) or

1 (60 minute activity) per day

Possible Choices:

Tutoring/Extra Help

SAT Prep Classes

College Meetings

Make up Tests

College Counseling

Project-based Learning



Personalized Learning Time

Students will be assigned to a default PLT (Homeroom)

Teachers can request students to attend mandatory PLT sessions for reasons such as make up assessments, tutoring, etc. **(TEACHER REQUESTED)**



AP

Research shows that students who score a 3 or above in at least one AP class have greater success and higher GPA in college

Ivy League schools want to see that not only students have taken all AP courses and have taken the test as well. Justification is requested when a test has not been taken

Most colleges and universities, that we spoke to, indicated that they do not consider the AP test scores as part of the admission process

Special recognition at graduation for AP Scholars - 3 AP course with score of 3/4/5 prior to your senior year

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AP Course Weighting

Students taking AP courses will get AP weighted grade credit regardless if they take the AP Exam at the end of the course.

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PE Requirements

CURRENTLY:

PE every year for 2 periods per week

0.4 credits/year or 1.6 total credits

2019 - 2020 RECOMMENDATION:

PE grades 9 and 10

Health grade 10 - paired with PE

PE Elective in grade 11/12 - students may choose

.50/year (3 years) or 1.5 total credits

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Science Labs

Remove science lab periods from Honors and Regular Biology, Chemistry, and Physics - labs will continue in these courses but completed during the regular periods

AP Science Courses will have science lab periods every other day (A or B Day)

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Steel Center

Discussing with Steel Center the option to allow students to attend in the AM or PM depending on what best fits their needs and program availability

Students receive a math and science credit, based on their Steel Center program, towards graduation credit

Honors - 4.5

No midterms and finals

Each quarter - 25%

Remove class rank

4.0 grade scale - A, B, C, D, F

25 Graduation Credits

Minimum failing grade in Q1 at 50%

All grades rounded up automatically

AP Scholar - 5 AP courses with exams, 3 by the end of your Junior year with 3-5 on exam

Letter grade and percentage on Transcript
