- Distance learning attendance expectations: All students are required to attend and participate in distance learning daily. Attendance will be recorded every school day. Attendance procedures for absences will remain unchanged for the duration of distance learning. Students must participate per the specifications of program instructors in order to be marked present and to receive credit. Please refer to the Attendance section of the *Student/Family Handbook* for details. Excuses (including those from physicians) are to be submitted directly to instructors for the duration of the building closure.
- Distance learning rules and procedures: All school rules and procedures, as outlined in the *Student/Family Handbook* and applicable to distance learning will be enforced in accordance with the policies governing Steel Center Tech. Students are expected to be attentive, cooperative, and productive for the duration of distance learning.
- Attention seniors: Per the Pennsylvania Department of Education in response to the COVID-19
 pandemic, all state-required standardized exams, including NOCTI have been waived and cancelled for
 the 2019-2020 school year. There will be no NOCTI exams this school year.
- The Cedar Point trip scheduled for June 1 has been cancelled. Those who already paid for the trip will receive refunds upon reopening of the school building. Those who participated in the hoagie fundraiser are to inform and return collected money to buyers. Steel Center is no longer authorizing the hoagie sale.
