

Apprenticeships offer something a typical 4-year degree doesn't – a paid job with a competitive wage from day one. Combined with structured classroom and on-the-job training, apprenticeships result in the skills and credentials that employers value.

94% of apprentices who complete an apprenticeship retain employment, with an average annual salary of \$70,000. Workers who complete apprenticeship programs earn approximately \$300,000 more during their career than their peers who do not. And many apprentices are able to earn credits towards an advanced degree while avoiding student debt.

Talent Attraction Program Jefferson (TAPJ) Questions & Answers

1. What is the TAPJ?

TAPJ is an educational program AHN Jefferson Hospital that partners with local allied health training institutions to attract and retain diverse employees into historically hard to fill positions.

2. Who can join the TAPJ?

Applicants come from an array of backgrounds from high school graduates to adult learners who are wanting to start a new career in healthcare.

3. What Allied Health Fields are covered by TAPJ?

TAPJ started with 10 Allied Health professions: Central Sterile Technician, Clinical Engineer, Facilities Technician, Imaging Technologist, Medical Lab Technologist, Patient Care Technician, Pharmaceutical Technologist, Phlebotomist, Respiratory Therapists and Licensed Practical Nurse. However, there are many more Allied Health professions. We are open to discussing all options with you.

4. What does TAPJ cover?

For the majority of applicants, TAPJ will cover full tuition plus books, assistance with transportation, uniforms, shoes and access to food resources if needed.

5. Why should I join the TAPJ?

In addition to the above benefits in Question #4, students are also matched with an AHN Jefferson. This relationship is what makes TAPJ unique and our students highly successful. Both the student and the mentor will be eligible for financial bonuses throughout their course of studies.

6. Who will be the mentor?

The TAPJ student will be matched with a mentor who is currently employed at the hospital in the Allied Health field in which the student is studying. The student and the mentor will meet regularly during the course of study to ensure the student is well supported.

7. Who are the partners for TAPJ?

This program is supported by a wonderful group of caring, community focused organizations: Allegheny Health Network, the Highmark Health Foundation, The Jefferson Regional Foundation, CCAC, the Bidwell Training Center, the AHN Jefferson Medical Staff and multiple private donors.

8. Will I received a tuition bill?

For those students who enter the CCAC Allied Health programs, the tuition is paid directly by AHN Jefferson. Bidwell Training Center programs are free of charge.

9. Do I owe AHN Jefferson anything after I graduate from the program?

Students who have their tuition covered for their Allied Health training program are required to accept a position at AHN Jefferson 2 years upon graduation. After two years, we are confident that you will love being an employee at AHN Jefferson and stay on with us for many years to follow.

"Year Up"

Offers a free one year program that empowers young adults (18-30 years old) to move from minimum wage to meaningful careers by ensuring that they gain the skills, experiences, and support necessary to reach their full potential and thrive in professional careers and higher education. Students spend six months learning in-demand technical and professional skills before applying their skills during a six-month corporate internship. Throughout the program, students complete coursework that may be eligible for college credits and receive access to a robust offering of services and support to promote their success.
